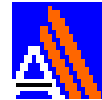

## **ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES**

In the following definitions of classes, First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Championship Agility, Premier Agility, Open Agility or Limited Agility Shows (i.e. special classes and invitational events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round completed within the course time set by the judge will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact obstacles and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso, classes are defined as follows:-

**Class Structure.** A class may be either held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

**Progression.** Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins in standard classes at that grade, except that progression from Grade 5 will require 3 wins at Grade 5, one of which must be an agility class. Progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

**Points Progression.** At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 4 by winning 100 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme. (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade. Progression on points must be done prior to the closing date of entries. It is not possible to change a grade once the entries have closed.

## **STANDARD CLASSES**

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and point's progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

### **Grade 1 (Elementary)**

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary), are not eligible for this class.*

### **Grade 2 (Starters)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters), are not eligible for this class.*

### **Grade 3 (Graduate)**

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

### **Grade 4 (Novice)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

### **Grade 5 (Intermediate)**

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

### **Grade 6 (Senior)**

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 3 first places at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, one of which must have been gained in an Agility (not Jumping) Class, and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

### **Grade 7 (Advanced)**

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

## **SPECIAL CLASSES**

### **(can not count towards agility warrant points or grade progression at KC shows)**

**VETERANS:** Open to all dogs 9 years or over on the day of the show and not entered in any other classes over the weekend (other Veteran and Any Size classes excepted). These classes will not include a tyre or weaves. Competitors can choose what height to jump (Medium, Small or Micro). The length of the long jump will be as per KC standard. All dogs will compete against each other over the same course with one set of awards.

**ANY SIZE:** Open to all dogs not entered in any other classes over the weekend (Veteran and Any size classes excepted.). These classes will not include a tyre or weaves. Competitors can choose what height to jump (Medium, Small or Micro). The length of the long jump will be as per KC standard. The course time will be 60 seconds. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course with one set of awards.

**JUNIORS:** All juniors must be under 18 on the day of competing. Under 12's is open to handlers under 12 years on show day and O12's is 12 years old and over (but under 18) on show day. All equipment heights will be in line with normal KC standard. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's applicable jump height with one set of awards for each age group. Each junior can only run a maximum of two dogs and any dog cannot be run by more than one junior.



## **DePhoto All Height Team Steeplechase**

This is a competition for teams of four dogs and handlers, run as a relay over a simple steeplechase jumping course. A steeplechase consists of a class made up of only jumps (not including spread or long jumps) and pipe tunnels (not including collapsible tunnel). Teams of four large, four medium or four small dogs run over the same course at their own height, under identical conditions. All heights will compete against each other with one set of awards.





## The Kennel Club Olympia Large Dog Novice Agility Stakes



### Rules of competition

This competition will be classified as combined Grades 3, 4 and 5 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

Dogs should be eligible to enter a Grades 3, 4 and 5 classes at the time of qualifying for the Quarter-Final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the Quarter-Final, Semi-Final or Final.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat. Competitors may qualify more than one dog for the Quarter-Final and also the Semi-Final at Olympia, handlers may only qualify a maximum of 2 dogs for the Olympia Grand Finals (highest placed in the Semi Finals). Once a dog has qualified for the Quarter-Final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placing's in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the Quarter-Finals/Semi-Finals.

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat will go forward to the Quarter-Finals at the Kennel Club International Agility Festival held in August, the first thirty six dogs from this Quarter-Final will qualify for the Semi-Final at the London Olympia Christmas International Horse Show.

The thirty six dogs who qualify for Olympia will compete in a Semi-Final at Olympia. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Semi-Final will qualify for the evening Grand Final at Olympia (subject to the above).

Novice Dogs will not be allowed to compete in both Novice and Senior Quarter-Finals, Semi-Final/Finals at Olympia.

Those dogs eligible to compete in Novice Large Dog Agility competitions are those measuring over 430mm (1foot 5 inches) at the withers.



## Crufts Large Novice ABC Agility Stakes (Special) 2014 - 2015

### **Eligibility**

This competition is a *special* agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses (i.e.: neither parent can be a Border Collie or Working Sheepdog). In the event of a dispute over the parentage of a dog, a decision will be left to the judge's discretion.

Those dogs eligible to compete in competition for Large dogs are those measuring over 430 mm (1foot 5 inches) at the withers.

Dogs should be eligible to compete at Grade 1 - 5 at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the semi-final or final.

### **Competition Rules**

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size for that height category. The semi-final and final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition. The winner of the Large Novice ABC Stakes will be the dog and handler with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

### **Qualifying**

There will be 10 qualifying shows throughout the year. The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded:

1st place = 10 points, 2nd place = 9 points etc. down to 10th place = 1 point. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10th even if the show does not award class places down to 10th.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which have/has not qualified. The top twenty dogs, with the most points, will be invited to a semi-final at Discover Dogs 2014. A maximum of two representatives of any one breed will be invited to the semi-final. This decision will be at the organisers' discretion. The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Crufts Dog Show, NEC Birmingham in March 2015.



## Crufts Medium ABC Agility Stakes (Special) 2014 - 2015

### **Eligibility**

This competition is a *special* agility competition open to all dogs excluding Border Collies, Working Sheepdogs and any of their crosses (ie:neither parent can be a Border Collie or Working Sheepdog). In the event of a dispute over the parentage of a dog, a decision will be left to the judge's discretion. Those dogs eligible to compete in Medium dog competition are those measuring over 350 mm (1 foot 1¾ inches) and those measuring 430 mm (1 foot 5 inches) or under at the withers and eligible to compete in combined Grades 1 to 7 for Medium dogs. This competition will be classified as combined Grades 1 to 7.

### **Competition Rules**

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size for that height category, The semi-final and final will consist of one round of agility competition and one round of jumping competition. The winner of the Medium ABC Stakes will be the dog and handler with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

### **Qualifying**

There will be 10 qualifying shows throughout the year. The first 10 placed dogs in each heat will have the following points awarded:

1st place = 10 points, 2nd place = 9 points etc. down to 10th place = 1 point. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 10th even if the show does not award class places down to 10th. If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which have/has not qualified. The top twenty dogs, with the most points, will be invited to a semi-final at Discover Dogs 2014. A maximum of two representatives of any one breed will be invited to the semi-final. This decision will be at the organisers' discretion.

The first ten highest placed dogs at the semi-final will be invited to compete in the finals to be held at Crufts Dog Show, NEC Birmingham in March 2015.



## Discover Dogs Small / Mixi Pairs Challenge (Special) 2014

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of jumping. The competition is open to small dogs, partnering either a medium dog or a large dog, and heats will be scheduled as a Special combined class for grades 1 to 7.

### Eligibility

The competition is open to two dogs with separate handlers. One dog must be a small dog, 35cm or under at the withers, the partner can be either a medium dog, over 35cm but 43cm or under at the withers, or a large dog, over 43cm in height. Handlers with more than one dog may enter in more than one pair. However, they may only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final. No surrogate handlers will be allowed in the final. Should a qualified dog or handler within a pair be unable/unfit to enter the final, that pair will not be able to compete. Their place in the final will be offered to the next available pair with the highest points who have not qualified.

### Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height for each category. This is a relay competition with a baton change taking place either in a box or behind a line at the judges' discretion. The competition will involve a change of height of the obstacles being jumped by the medium/large dogs at one stage during the class. The judge will decide which height of dog to start with and will announce the change of height when relevant. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available accordingly. The course will be walked by everyone before the beginning of the class. The final will consist of two rounds of jumping competition. The winners of the Discover Dogs Small/Mixi pairs will be the pair with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

### Qualifying

Points will be awarded to the specific pair (consisting of two handlers with their dogs) which competes at the heat. Points are not transferable between different pair combinations. Pairs will score 15 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 15th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 15 pairs with the most points will go through to the final at Discover Dogs 2014.

## YKC Young Kennel Club 2015

## Crufts YKC Jumping 2015

### Rules of Competition

- YKC Members aged 6-17 years can take part in these qualifiers.
- The first placed handler and dog in each sub division at each qualifying class will be invited to take part in the YKC Jumping Final at Crufts 2015.
- Open to Young Kennel Club members only.
- Dogs entered must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
- If your dog is a rescue or crossbreed, the Kennel Club has an Activity Register for dogs that do not qualify for the breed register.
- Members are only permitted to handle one dog in the Final at Crufts.
- If a handler has qualified more than one dog they will have to choose which dog to run.
- The next placed dog in the heat will be offered the place.
- There are six classes divided by age of member and size of dog as listed below:
  - Under 12 (Handlers 6 years and up to, but not including 12<sup>th</sup> birthday) Large Dogs – Medium Dogs – Small Dogs
  - 12 and Over (Handlers 12 years and up to, but not including 18<sup>th</sup> birthday) Large Dogs – Medium Dogs – Small Dogs

### Rules of Competition

- (1) This class will be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
- (2) All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
- (3) The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large height grades 3, 4 and 5.
- (4) Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
- (5) Once a dog has qualified for the final it may not enter any further heats except as a not for competition entry. Handlers running not for competition with a previously qualified dog must report to the Show Secretary before running in the class.
- (6) The first four dogs from each heat will be invited to compete in the final in 2015.
- (7) The next four dogs from each heat will be held as reserves.
- (8) In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
- (9) In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.
- (10) The first section of the competition will contain the following pieces of equipment: A Frame, Dog Walk, See Saw, a rising spread jump and a long jump. The placement of these obstacles is at the Judge's discretion.
- (11) The first section is un-timed and dogs must successfully complete this section without faults before proceeding to the second section of the competition. Dogs with faults will not be allowed to proceed to the second section.
- (12) The second section is timed and will contain no more than fourteen but no less than twelve single pole hurdles plus a set of twelve weaves. The placement of these obstacles is at the Judge's discretion.
- (13) Handlers are not allowed to touch their dogs between the separate elements of the first section but may touch their dogs between the first and second sections of the competition.
- (14) The object of the competition is to complete the control section of the class successfully before competing, against the clock, on a jumping course. The winner and subsequent places will be decided on the fastest time with least faults over the second section of the course. Dogs will run under the new height regulations.



## The Laser knockout pairs (Special)



### Rules of Competition

The 'Laser' Knockout Pairs is a fun competition, sponsored by Adams Agility

- 1) The class will be open to all large dogs.
  - 2) There will be eight qualifying heats. The top four pairs from each heat will qualify for the Final, which will take place on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> August 2014 at Adams Open Show at Catton Hall. Once a pair has qualified for the final, they may not run in further heats for the final which they have qualified for.
  - 3) Handlers may enter more than one pair. Dogs may only compete in one pair in any heat. If a handler has entered more than one pair and is drawn to run against themselves, they may nominate another handler to run one of the dogs. That handler must then continue to run the dog for the rest of the heat and if they qualify for the final, they must run the dog in the final. Alternatively the handler can nominate which pair should continue in the heat.
  - 4) The pairs will compete against each other over two similar courses. There will be a judge for each course. There will be a baton change between the first and second handler which must take place behind a line, failure to do so will incur 100 faults. Time and faults will be added together and the winning pair will be the one with the lowest time. The judges' decision will be final.
  - 5) The course will consist of 10 obstacles, made up of jumps, tunnels and weaves (6 poles) only. Normal marking will apply. If a dog is eliminated, it will incur 100 faults. Should both pairs be eliminated, the pair which was eliminated first will lose.
  - 6) The winning pairs from each round will go through to the next round until there is only one pair remaining.
  - 7) Pairs will be issued with a running order which must be strictly adhered to. Pairs failing to run when due will be knocked out and the other pair will go through to the next round.
  - 8) Only handlers and dogs originally entered may compete at the final (except in the case of rule 3). Any changes are at the organisers' discretion.
- The winners and runners up for each heat will receive a trophy and rosettes will be presented to the last 8 pairs.

### Rules for the Just So Jump and Twist Pairs



1. This class is open to pairs of the same height, small, medium and large. It is open to grades 1-7.
2. It is a combined class with one set of awards.
3. One dog will complete an agility course and the other dog a jumping course.
4. The judge will decide which course will be run first.
5. The agility course shall consist of twelve obstacles and must include three contacts (they do not have to be three different pieces of contact equipment) and twelve weaves.
6. The jumping course shall consist of twelve obstacles one of which must be twelve weaves.
7. There will be a changeover box and a baton exchange in the box.
8. A faulty baton exchange will incur 100 faults.
9. The first three pairs will qualify for the final which will be at Tag Summer Show
10. Once a pair has qualified they may enter other heats for competition but the place in the final will be awarded to the next highest placed pair who has not qualified.



## **Brillo International Bounce**



### Brillo International Bounce Rules

Two Dog Agility competitions; one for Small Dogs Grades 1 –7 and one for Medium Dogs Grades 1 –7. There will be at least 10 heats for each size of dog held at shows around the country with the top 3 of each size qualifier (30 qualifiers per size) being invited to the final. The class must be judged using current Kennel Club rules and each host venue may choose which grades each qualifier is included. The final is open to all grades of dog from 1-7 however each host venue may choose which grades their qualifier is open to. The class must be an agility or jumping class. Each heat must be open to a minimum of two different Grades e.g. 1-3 or 4-5 combined. Each host venue provides 3 qualifiers at each size to take to the final.

The Final will consist of 2 rounds (1 Agility and 1 Jumping) at size which will not be timed (max time specified) and double clears will go towards the Final round. In the event of no double clears then dogs with the minimum combined faults will be selected. All double clears will compete in the final jumping round against the clock to find winners and enjoy a share of the £50 prize money at each size...

The Finals will be held at Blenheim ATC Agility Show Weekend at West Midlands Showground, Shrewsbury on Saturday 6th September 2014.

#### Notes

1. Once a dog has qualified (i.e. 3 finalists per heat per size) this eliminates the dog from taking a further finalist place and the next highest placed dog(s) in Brillo International Bounce Qualifier will be invited to the final.
2. Any surrogate handlers must be notified in writing by 15 August 2014 to competition organisers.
3. No amendments after this date and non-advice will disqualify the partnership.
4. Enquiries relating to each heat should be addressed to the organising club.
5. The organisers reserve the right to withhold an invitation to the final without explanation.

Trophies and rosettes will be awarded in these classes as per normal standard graded classes. The Brillo International Bounce awards and qualifying places will be awarded to the top three across a Combined 1-7 result.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete (ATC) number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
3. Entry fees are £2.90 per dog per class, £5.80 per pair and £11.60 per team.  
Camping fees are: £25.00 per unit for 3 nights. Camping available: Thursday (after 5pm), Friday & Saturday nights.
4. No Prize Money is on offer.
5. Entries will only be accepted on the official form or photocopy thereof. Entries may also be made via the internet at [www.simplycanine.co.uk](http://www.simplycanine.co.uk).
6. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
7. Only dogs of 18 calendar months of age and over on the day of competition are eligible for competition at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
8. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
9. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
10. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
11. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
12. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
13. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
14. Thank you to our sponsors, The Kennel Club, Adams Agility, TuffStuff, Joy Hitchcock, Armitages Pet Products Ltd, Pawstrading, Skinners, YKC, Yumove, Feelwells, Mini Pinky Doughnuts, Lintbells, Jewlnick Leather, Dephoto.
15. The KC qualifiers held at this show are:- Crufts Large Novice ABC Agility Stakes. Crufts Medium ABC Agility Stakes. Large KC Olympia Novice, Discover Dogs Small/Mixi Pairs Challenge (special) 2014. Crufts YKC Jumping. Detailed rules can be found on the previous page.
16. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply for all standard classes.
17. The height of hurdles for Veterans classes will be 450mm for dogs running at medium height and 350mm or 228mm for dogs running at small & micro height. For the Anysize class the hurdles will be the same as for Veterans. All other equipment in all other special classes will be as per KC standard.
18. The Height limit for dogs:
  - a. Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
  - b. Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
  - c. Small Dogs – For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
19. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled in the class by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
20. Withdrawal of dogs from Competition - A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:
  - a. A bitch, which is in season.
  - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
  - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
  - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
  - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
21. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (30/06/2014) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitors' responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
22. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
23. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses. If the show processor has the provisions to do so, competitors will be refunded in the manner in which they had entered the show, but in any event the society will refund fees within 3 months of the show date to all those who had entered and requested a refund within 1 month of the show date.
24. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
25. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
26. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
27. Passes are not required to gain entry to the show/showground.
28. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
29. It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel Club.
30. **Animals in Event** - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
31. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits
32. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
33. **Welfare of Dogs** An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations
34. All dogs entered at this show are at the owner's risk. Whilst every care will be taken, the Committee and Organisers will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused to persons, dogs or property at the show.
35. Overpaid entries will NOT be refunded.
36. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries and any person directing abuse will be removed from the showground.
37. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of the committee.
38. Campers must remain within their allocated space and MUST NOT obstruct the roadways. All units must be equipped with own fire extinguishers and/or bucket of water at the tow bar.

39. Training equipment is not allowed.
40. DOGS ARE NOT TO BE LEFT LOOSE IN 'GARDEN' AREAS OR TETHERED TO VEHICLES WITHOUT BEING ATTENDED.
41. No overnight parking permitted unless a camping space has been booked and paid for and you are within your allocated space. Any persons with vehicles parked overnight, not in accordance with this rule, will be asked to leave the showground.
42. Please pick up after your dog and deposit the waste in the bags provided. If you fail to clean up after your dog, you will be asked to leave the venue.
43. No refunds after closing date other than exceptional circumstances.
44. Rosettes and Trophies will NOT be forwarded.

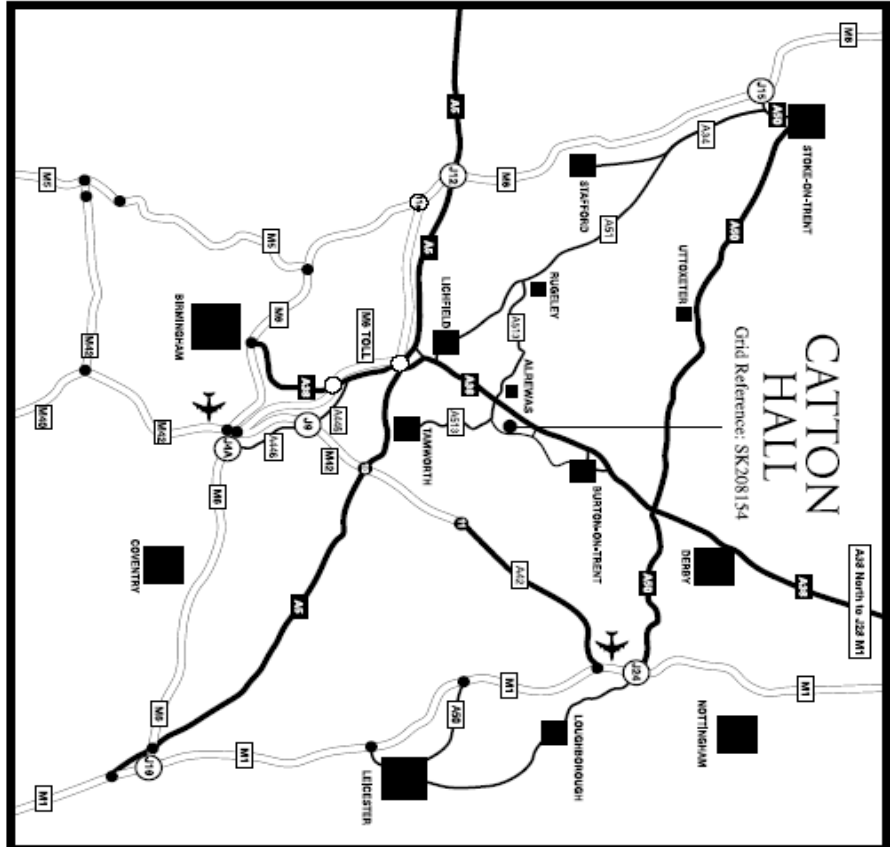
