ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

In the following definitions of classes, First Prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. Limited Agility Shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round within course time will count towards grade progression.

Agility classes to include contact points and Jumping classes where there are not contact obstacles. With this proviso, classes are defined as follows:-
Class Structure. A class may be either held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, (Regulation K3.c refers), except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

STANDARD CLASSES

Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handle for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and point's progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)

For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary), are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 2 (Starters)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. *N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters), are not eligible for this class.*

Grade 3 (Graduate)

Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 4 (Novice)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.

Grade 5 (Intermediate)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.

Grade 6 (Senior)

Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.

Grade 7 (Advanced)

Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of 4 first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows, 2 first places must be gained in Agility (not Jumping) Classes.

SPECIAL CLASSES

VETERANS: Open to all dogs 7 years or over on the day of the show and not entered in any other classes over the weekend (other Veteran classes excepted). These classes will not include a tyre or weaves. Large Dogs can choose to jump at 450mm or 350mm (Medium or Small heights) and Medium and Small dogs can choose to jump 350mm or 228mm (Small or Micro). There will be one set of awards for large dogs and one set of awards for small/medium dogs.

JUNIORS: All juniors must be under 18 on the day of competing. Under 12's is open to handlers under 12 years on showday and O12's is 12 years old and over (but under 18) on showday. All heights of dogs will compete against each other over the same course at the dog's applicable jump height with one set of award for each age group. Each Junior can only run a maximum of two dogs and any dog can not be run by more than one junior.

HELTER SKELTER: A circular jumping course. No weaves.

The Kennel Club Olympia Large Dog Novice Agility Stakes Supported by Pedigree

Rules of competition

This competition will be classified as combined Grades 3, 4 and 5 and judged under the Kennel Club regulations for standard classes.

Dogs should be eligible to enter a Grades 3, 4 and 5 class at the time of qualifying for the semi-final. Any subsequent wins gained by the dog will not alter its eligibility to compete in the semi-final.

Competitors may enter more than one dog in a heat and may qualify more than one dog for the semi-finals. Handlers may only qualify one dog for the final which will be the highest placed dog at the semi-final. Once a dog has qualified for the semi-final/final, further heats may be entered for competition although any placings in these further heats will not affect the dog's eligibility for the final/semi finals.

The first three previously unqualified placed dogs from each heat or split class will go forward to one of the two semi-finals at the City of Birmingham Show at Stoneleigh. The first eighteen dogs from each semi-final will qualify for the final at Olympia.

The 36 dogs who qualify for Olympia will be invited to compete in a further semi final at Olympia. The top ten highest placed dogs in the Olympia semi final will qualify for evening grand final at Olympia.

Those dogs eligible to compete in Novice Large Dog Agility competitions are those measuring over 430mm (1 foot 5 inches) at the withers.



DFS CRUFTS SMALL DOG AGILITY CHALLENGE 2011/2012 **RULES**

This is a competition consisting of eight heats, open to Small dogs measuring 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers. Heats will be scheduled as a standard combined agility class for grades 1 to 7.

Eligibility

Competitors may enter as many dogs as they like in the heats but can only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final.

Competition rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height/length stated for small dogs.

The final consists of two rounds of agility competitions known as Part 1 and Part 2. The winner of the Challenge will be the dog and handler with the least combined faults in the fastest combined time calculated over the two rounds of the final.

Qualifying

Competitors at heats will score 20 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 20th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 20 dogs with the most points will qualify for the final at DFS Crufts 2012. Qualifying points will be awarded down to 20th even if the show does not award class places down to 20th.

If a qualified handler or dog is unable/unfit to attend the final, reserves will be taken from dog/s with the highest number of points from the heats which have/has not qualified.



DFS CRUFTS SMALL/MIXI PAIRS CHALLENGE (SPECIAL) 2011/2012 **RULES**

This is a competition consisting of eight heats of jumping. The competition is open to small dogs, partnering either a medium dog or a large dog, and heats will be scheduled as a Special combined class for grades 1 to 7.

Eligibility

The competition is open to two dogs with separate handlers. One dog must be a small dog, 35cm or under at the withers, the partner can be either a medium dog, over 35cm but 43cm or under at the withers, or a large dog, over 43cm in height.

Handlers with more than one dog may enter in more than one pair. However, they may only qualify a maximum of two dogs for the final. No surrogate handlers will be allowed in the final.

Should a qualified dog or handler within a pair be unable/unfit to enter the final, reserves will be taken from the pair with the highest points who have not qualified.

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entering the competition will be deemed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum height for each category.

This is a relay competition with a baton change taking place either in a box or behind a line at the judges' discretion.

The competition will involve a change of height of the obstacles being jumped by the medium/large dogs at one stage during the class. The judge will decide which height of dog to start with and will announce the change of height when relevant. It is the competitors' responsibility to be available accordingly. The course will be walked by everyone before the beginning of the class.

Qualifying

Points will be awarded to the specific pair (consisting of two handlers with their dogs) who compete at the heat. Points are not transferable between different pair combinations.

Pairs will score 15 points for 1st place down to 1 point for 15th place. Points will be accumulated over all eight heats and the 15 pairs with the most points will go through to the final at DFS Crufts 2012.

The winner of the Small / Mixi Pairs Challenge will be the pair with the fastest time with the least faults.



DFS CRUFTS SMALL DOG CIRCULAR KNOCK-OUT (SPECIAL) 2011/2012 RULES

The competition is open to small dogs, measuring 35cm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers, and heats will be scheduled as a Special combined class for grades 1 to 7. A draw will be made for each heat.

Eligibility

Competitors may enter more than one dog for each heat but may only qualify one dog for the final. Their first dog to qualify will be invited to the final. Once qualified a handler or dog may not compete in any further heats.

The competitor to go through to the next round of a heat will be the first to finish with the least number of faults.

Competition Rules

The competition will be held under Kennel Club rules and regulations for Agility and any handler entered will be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations. Standard rules will apply and all equipment used shall be of a standard size set at the maximum size stated for small dogs.

This is a circular knock-out and in the interest of safety there will be no collapsible tunnel, dog walk or see-saw. The course will contain weaving poles.

It is the competitors' responsibility to book in at the show if necessary and also to be at the ring when needed.

Dogs will start and finish from a line in the middle of the circle. Equipment may be used on this line although in the interest of safety it must be off-set so that the dogs are not running at each other when finishing.

Should a faster dog catch up with the other dog, the slower dog **MUST** stand clear to allow the faster dog to pass it by.

It is the handlers responsibility to ensure that any dogs that are likely to be aggressive on a circular course where they are competing with another dog and may pass or be passed by another dog should **NOT** be entered. Any dog displaying any kind of aggressive behaviour on the course **WILL BE ELIMINATED IMMEDIATELY**.

False start ruling will be made at the judges discretion.

Qualifying

There will be eight heats of the Small Dog Circular Knock-out and the dogs/handlers in the first two places in each heat will qualify for the final at DFS Crufts 2012.



The Adams Derby Novice Special

Rules of Competition

- (1) This class will be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
- (2) All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
- (3) The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at Large height grades 3, 4 and 5.
- (4) Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
- (5) Once a dog has qualified for the final it may not enter any further heats except as a not for competition entry. Handlers running not for competition with a previously qualified dog must report to the Show Secretary before running in the class.
- (6) The first four dogs from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.
- (7) The next four dogs from each heat will be held as reserves.
- (8) In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
- (9) In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.
- (10) The first section of the competition will contain the following pieces of equipment: A Frame, Dog Walk, See Saw, a rising spread jump and a long jump. The placement of these obstacles is at the Judge's discretion.
- (11) The first section is un-timed and dogs must successfully complete this section without faults before proceeding to the second section of the competition. Dogs with faults will not be allowed to proceed to the second section.
- (12) The second section is timed and will contain no more than fourteen but no less than twelve single pole hurdles plus a set of twelve weaves. The placement of these obstacles is at the Judge's discretion.
- (13) Handlers are not allowed to touch their dogs between the separate elements of the first section but may touch their dogs between the first and second sections of the competition.
- (14) The object of the competition is to complete the control section of the class successfully before competing, against the clock, on a jumping course. The winner and subsequent places will be decided on the fastest time with least faults over the second section of the course.
- (15) Dogs will run under the new height regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/Authority to Compete number will be required for each entry.
2. Entry fees are £2.80 per dog per class and £5.60 per pair.
Camping fees are: £20.00 per unit for 3 nights. Camping available: Thursday (after 5pm), Friday & Saturday nights.
3. No Prize Money is on offer.
4. Entries will only be accepted on the official form or photocopy thereof. Entries may also be made via the internet at www.simplycanine.co.uk.
5. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
6. Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible to compete at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
7. Not For Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
8. No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
9. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the Show.
10. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting, leather or webbing collar is permitted, providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
11. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
12. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.

14. Kennel Club Standard marking Regulations apply.
15. The height of hurdles for Veterans classes will be 450mm or 350mm for large dogs and 350mm or 228mm for small & medium dogs.
16. The Height limit for dogs:
 - a. Large Dogs – For dogs measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers
 - b. Medium Dogs - For dogs measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) and measuring 430mm (1ft 5ins) or under at the withers.
 - c. Small Dogs – For dogs measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or under at the withers.
17. Judges at an Agility Show may not enter for competition a dog, which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the Show at which they are judging.
18. Withdrawal of dogs from Competition - A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from an Agility Show if it is:
 - a. A bitch, which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious diseases or contagious disease.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
19. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the start of the competition (04/07/2011) shall be counted when entering for any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitors' responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class (es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding number as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
20. Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
21. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the club will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
22. Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
23. Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
24. Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied with the appropriate fees.
25. Passes are not required to gain entry to the show/showground.
26. Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious or Infectious Disease – No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the Competition may compete. Competitors infringing the Regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club Rule A42.
27. **Animals in Event** - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
28. All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a Kennel Club Registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
29. A pay on the day class will be held if time permits
30. A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
31. Welfare of Dogs
An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations
32. All dogs entered at this show are at the owner's risk. Whilst every care will be taken, the Committee and Organisers will not accept responsibility for loss, damage or injury, however caused to persons, dogs or property at the show.
33. Overpaid entries will NOT be refunded.
34. Competitors must follow the instructions of the Stewards with respect to parking, camping and conduct within the show boundaries and any person directing abuse will be removed from the showground.
35. Goods may NOT be sold within the precincts of the show without prior permission of the committee.
36. Campers must remain within their allocated space and MUST NOT obstruct the roadways. All units must be equipped with own fire extinguishers and/or bucket of water at the tow bar.
37. Training equipment is not allowed.
38. **DOGS ARE NOT TO BE LEFT LOOSE IN 'GARDEN' AREAS OR TETHERED TO VEHICLES WITHOUT BEING ATTENDED.**
39. No overnight parking permitted unless a camping space has been booked and paid for and you are within your allocated space. Any persons with vehicles parked overnight, not in accordance with this rule, will be asked to leave the showground.
40. Please pick up after your dog and deposit the waste in the bags provided. If you fail to clean up after your dog, you will be asked to leave the venue.
41. No refunds after closing date other than exceptional circumstances.
42. Rosettes and Trophies will NOT be forwarded.

The Committee of Derbyshire would like to thank all members, sponsors, ring parties from other clubs and volunteers without who this show would not be possible.

Welfare of Dogs

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog (s) are met, and should not put their dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after you dogs welfare.

WARNING: if your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

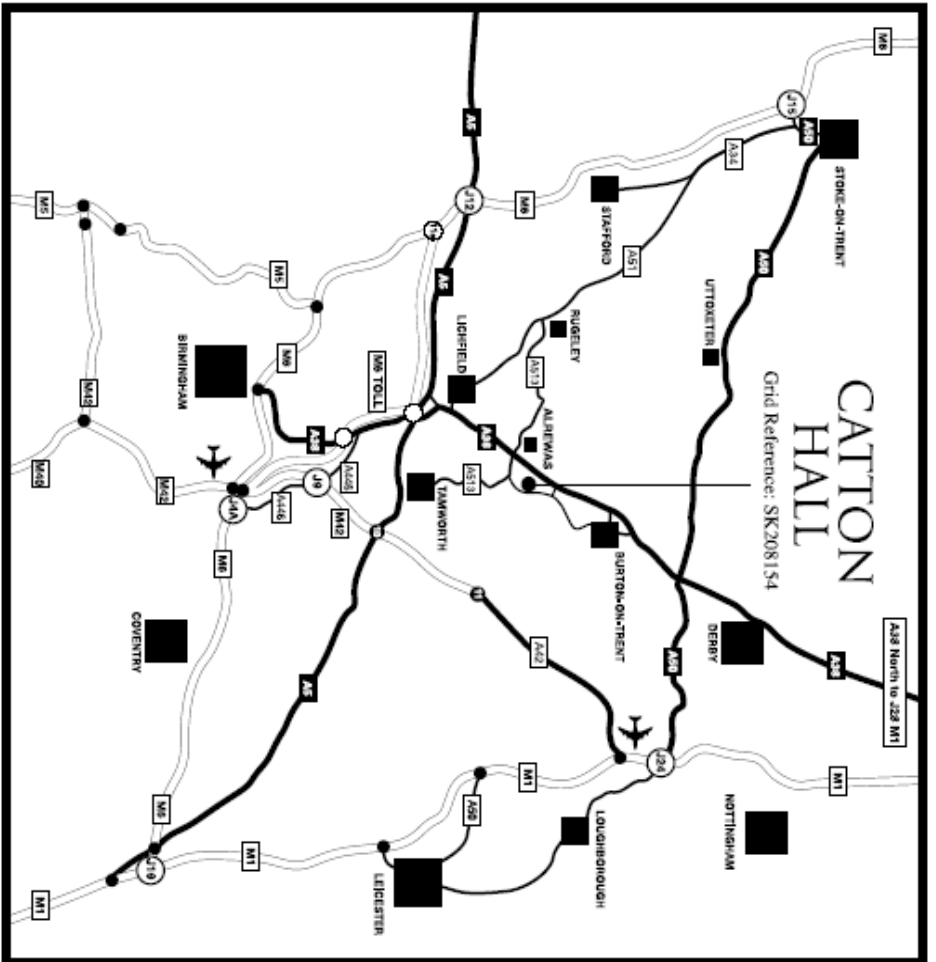
